

# FIP No Longer Means Goodbye: The Treatment That's Saving Cats' Lives

How breakthrough antivirals transformed a death sentence into a treatable disease

What is FIP? A serious disease caused by a feline coronavirus mutation. While 80-90% of cats in multi-cat homes carry the virus, only a small percentage develop FIP.

# Important: Feline Coronavirus is NOT the Same as COVID-19.

While 80–90% of cats in multi-cat environments encounter feline coronavirus during their lives, the vast majority remain healthy carriers. Only a small minority experience the rare mutation that leads to FIP.

**Early Signs:** Lethargy, low appetite, weight loss, intermittent fevers.

# **Two forms of FIP**

- Wet (effusive): fluid in abdomen or chest; bloating or breathing effort
- Dry (non-effusive): inflammation of eyes, brain, or organs; harder to spot

The FIP Diagnosis: There's no single test.

Veterinarians combine:

- Clinical exam + history
- Bloodwork (protein/inflammation patterns)
- Fluid analysis and/or PCR when fluid is present
- Imaging (often ultrasound); biopsy only in select cases



Can You Prevent FIP? Not completely. Reduce risk: clean litter daily (1 box/cat +1), keep cat groups small & stable, quarantine new cats 2-3 weeks, minimize stress. If FIP is suspected, early treatment can save lives.

#### **BREAKTHROUGH: NEW TREATMENT OPTIONS**

FIP was once fatal—today we have hope! While supportive care only eased symptoms temporarily, antivirals like remdesivir and GS-441524 have transformed outcomes since 2021. These life-saving medications are now accessible through compounding pharmacies. Early treatment is everything.
